



## Installation Information

### CUTTING

You can cut Foundry Art tiles with any saw suitable for cutting metal. Hardware stores sell abrasive metal-cutting blades for use with circular or miter saws. A hacksaw will also work if you have just a few cuts to make.

### ADHESIVE

Foundry Art bronze tiles may be installed with normal thinset adhesive. Epoxy adhesive may also be used. To insure a good adhesive bond we recommend roughing up the back of the tiles with course sandpaper.

### GROUTING

**During your final clean-up use a small brush to make sure all grout residue is removed from the recesses of the tiles.** No grout release is necessary.

### SEALING

Sealing is not necessary, although after installation we recommend applying a light coat of paste wax to slow down the patina process.

### NO ACID

As with any polished surface, Bronzework Studio tiles should be protected from acid-based cleaning agents, including many grout haze removers.

### FOR BEST RESULTS IN FLOORS

Set the tiles so they are a hair's width higher than the surrounding field material. This way, they will be continuously buffed by footsteps.
